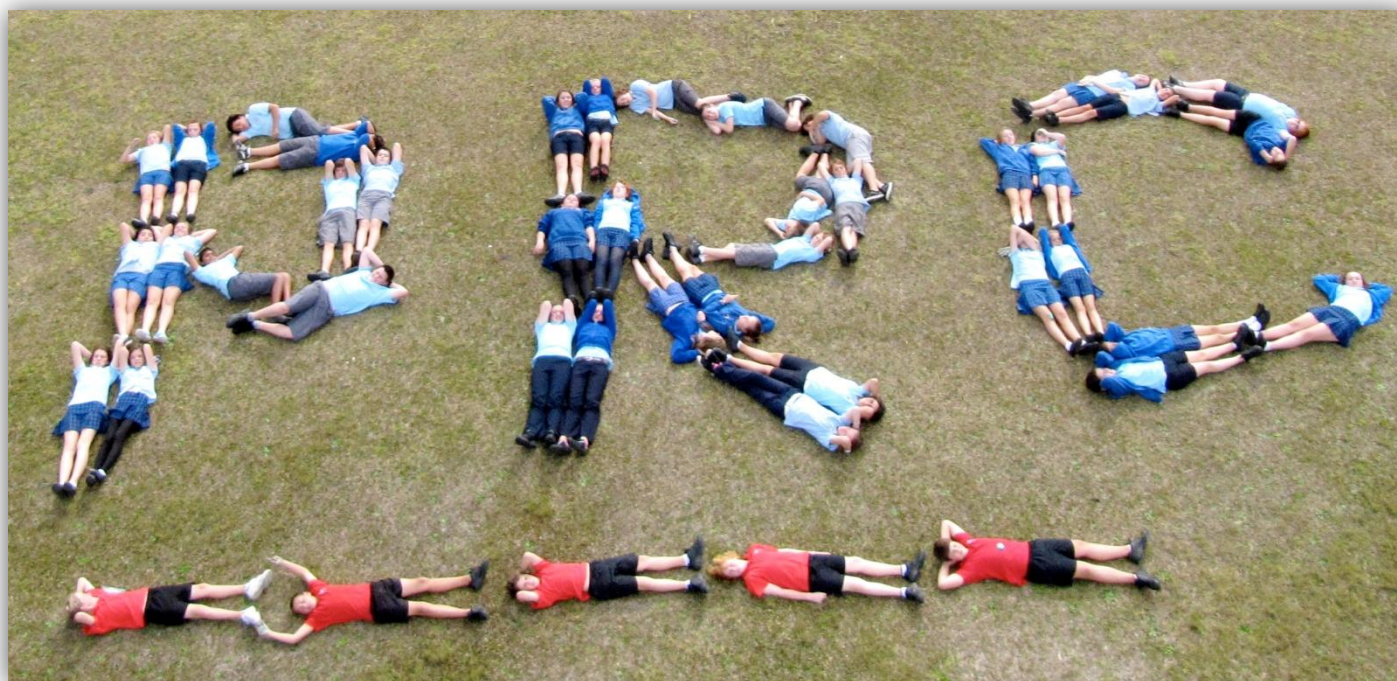




NSW Premier's Reading Challenge 2010

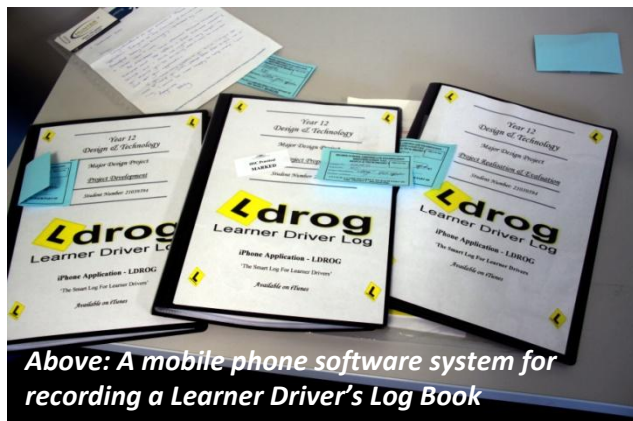

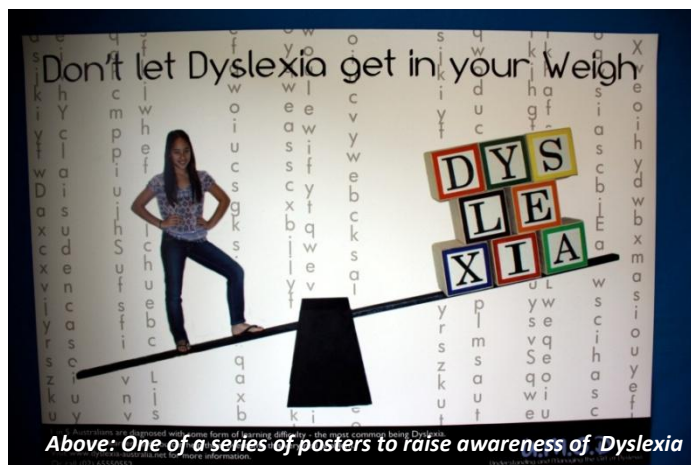
